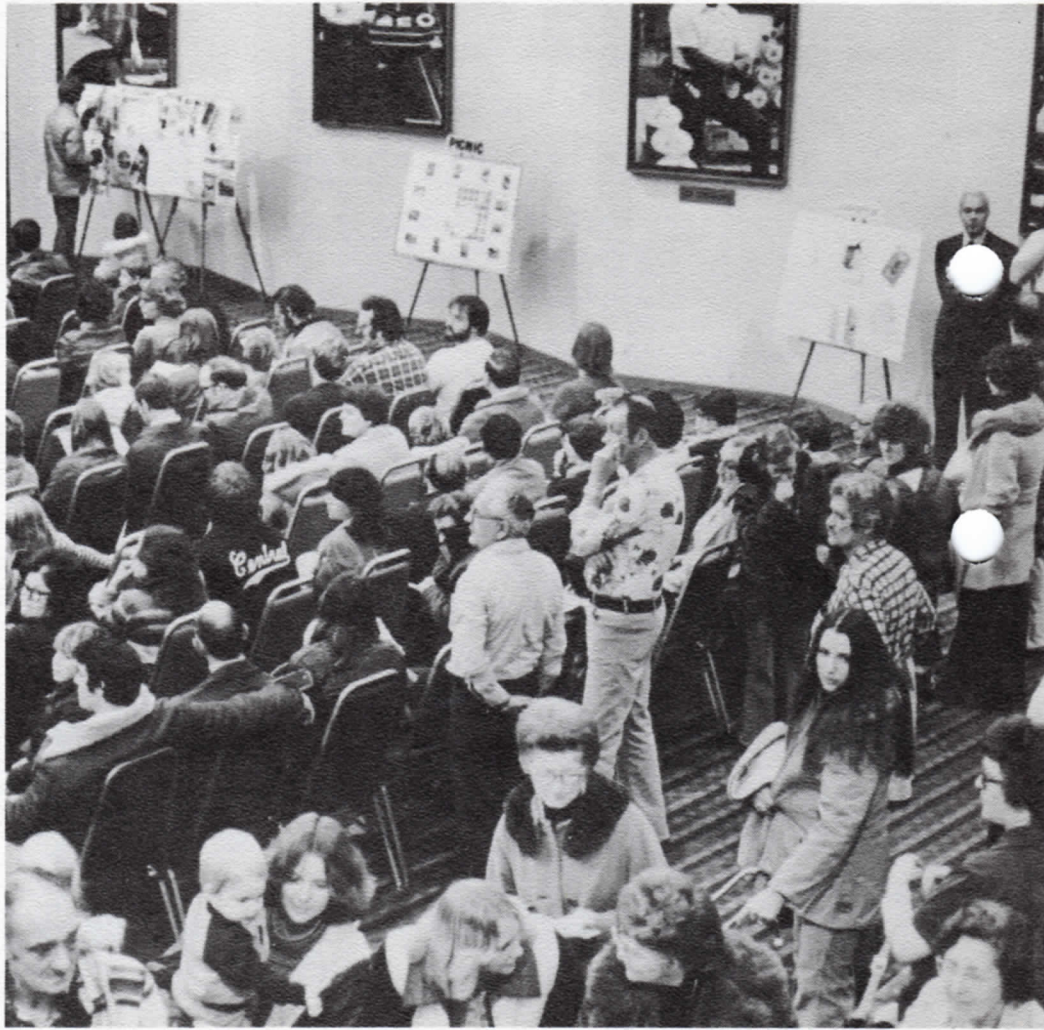

On these pages are pictures of some of those who visited the plant. The party may be over, but the memory lingers.

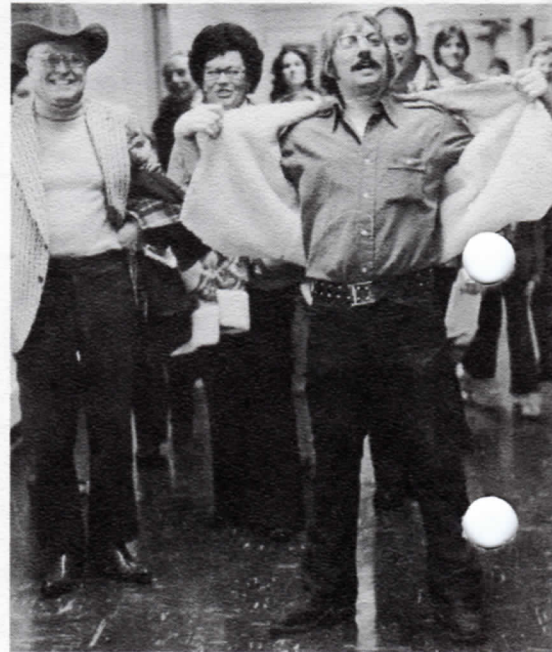




"C'mon, Dad, before the cookies are all gone!"

"Well, I'll be. I didn't know Bob Dinslage could even bait a hook."



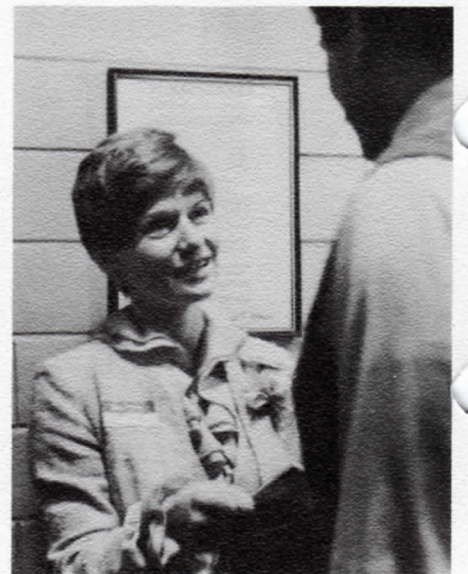
"No job is so important that we can't take the time to work safely . . . or to smile."
