This Christmas season THE WESTERNER brings you something new and unique.

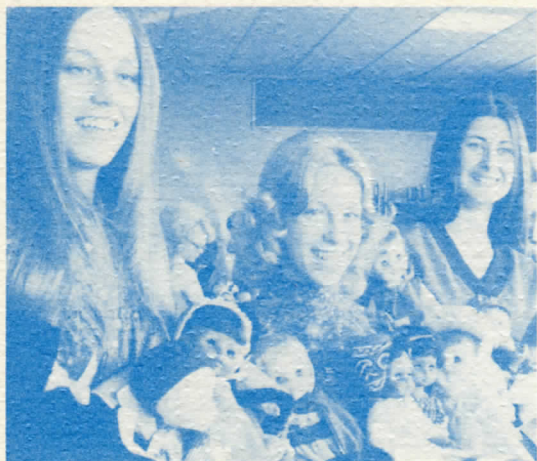
