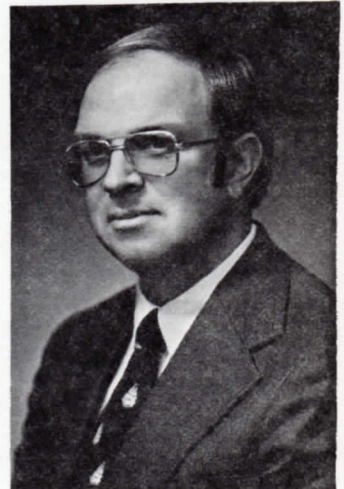

Manufacturing Vice President Appointed

J. F. (Jack) McKinnon, director of manufacturing at the Reading Works, has been promoted to manufacturing vice president (formerly titled general manager) at the Omaha Works, effective April 15, 1986. Jack Childs, the Omaha Works' current manufacturing vice president, is retiring. McKinnon and Childs will have concurrent authority until May 31, when McKinnon will replace Childs.


McKinnon is a native of Lynn, Mass., and holds a bachelor of science degree in electrical engineering from Merrimack College in North Andover, Mass., and a master of business administration degree in management from Butler University in Indianapolis, Ind. He has had various assignments since joining the company as a product engineer at the Merrimack Valley Works in August 1962, including assignments at the Omaha Works.

After participating in the company's management training program in 1971, he came to the Omaha Works as a department chief and was promoted to assistant manager of engineering in June 1973. He later became assistant manager of personnel and labor relations before his transfer to the company's switching equipment division office in Chicago. McKinnon served in product planning--operations support systems in Warrenton, Ill., first as assistant manager and then beginning in March 1977 as manager. He was assigned to various duties as manager at the Allentown Works before he became the director of manufacturing at the Reading Works in November 1982.

McKinnon is married and has four children. He served in the U.S. Coast Guard in 1962 and currently is a lieutenant commander in the Coast Guard Reserve.
